This is the 143rd Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and 26th sthalam on south side of river Kaveri in Chozha Nadu. The temple is centre of Kumbakonam city near Potramarai kulam. Mottai Gopuram is the land mark of this temple.

In Periyapuranam Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva of Sivapuram and Thirunavukkarasu Swamigal from Thiruvalanchuzhi. Moolavar: Sri Adi Kumbeswarar, Sri Amuthesuwarar Consort: Sri Mangalambigai. Some of the Important features of this temple are....

The temple is facing east with a 9 tier Rajagopuram. Except south, the other three directions has the Rajagopuras and three prakaras. After Rajagopuram Vinayakar and Dhandapani sannadhis, Dwajasthambam, Rishabam (Nandhi is little big and beautiful) and balipeedam are under the recent period Mandapam. There is a 3 tier second level Rajagopuram Moolavar is little big made of sand, under a golden kavacham in inclined position. No abhishekam is done and punuku is applied. The Shiva Linga top looks like

In Prakaram Navagraha Sannidhi, Vallabha Vinayagar, 63 var, Urchavars, Veerabhadra, Saptha Kannis, Ashta Lingas, Somaskandar Sannadhi, Valanchuzhi Vinayagar, Mahalingeswarar, Pichadanar, Shanmugar, Karthikeya, Shiva Lingas, Annapoorani, Maha Lakshmi, Saraswati and Ambal Sannadhi.

mouth of a kalasa.

Ambal is in a separate sannadhi facing south. There are 14 theerthas. Next to Bhairavar (Kiratha murti) who had broken the Amirtha Kuda with arrow, Jurahareswarar with 3 legs, Govinda Dekshithar with his wife, Chandran, Suryan and Natarajar Sabha. The 15th Century Saint Arunagirinathar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Muruga of this temple. ARCHITECTURE

The sanctum sanctorum consists of sanctum, antarala and artha mandapam. A Vesara vimana is on the sanctum. Unfinished Rajagopuram is called as mottai gopuram which is a land mark for this temple. Architecture is beautiful and some of the stucco images are damaged. Hindu deities are in the Mandapa niches and over the mandapa parapet wall. HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

There is a saying that the Kumbakonam has many temples both Saivam and Vaishnavam. Even though in literatures, this place was mentioned as Kudamooku, now called as Kumbakonam. Once in 12 years Mahamaham is conducted in Mahamaha Theertha Tank on the day when Guru stands in Simha rasi and

Chandran in Kumbha Rasi. The Mahamaha Theertha tank is spreads over 15 acres and it has 9 wells and 16 sannadhis around the 4 banks. Apart from small temples, the Kumbakonam has 14 big temples with 14 tanks. They are Brahma theertheesam, Mukunthesam, Thanesam, Rishabesam, Banesam, Konesam, Bhakthesam, Bhairavesam, Agasthesam, Vyakesam, Gangadharesam, Bramesam and Moothatheerhesam. In addition to this temples, it has 14 Theerthas has, 7 Thadahas, 3 wells and 4 rivers steps. The maintenance of these tanks and Vimanas of 16 Shiva temples was built during Vijayanagara period by Achuthappa nayak's minister Govinda Dheekshithar. He carried out all these with Gold with thulabharam ie equal amount of his weight. His stone image is in Kumbeswarar Temple. Govinda Dekshithar was instrumental in establishing Raja Veda Padasala, Schools, Pushba mandapas with Jodi / twin Vimanas, Velvi Sala next to Raja Veda Pada Sala, The Silver

Chariot & Rishaba vahanam at Thiruvidaimaruthur and

A bandoned tricycle and construction waste form a conducive environment for mosquito breeding. The Greater Chennai Corporation will soon install AI-enabled CCTV cameras to monitor garbage hotspots to ensure that those dumping waste in public places are identified and action is taken to collect fines. These AI-enabled CCTV cameras will monitor hotspots of garbage vulnerable points and will be linked with the Integrated Command and Control Centre at the Ripon Building. Construction waste is dumped with absence of any action by the concerned civic authorities. The GCC had urged residents to segregate dry and wet waste in two different bins and hand it over to workers during door-to-door collection.

It is an eyesore to see garbage dumped at the entrance of the street. Lack of awareness has resulted in poor maintenance. The garbage dump serves as an open urinal making the stretch feel uncomfortable. Residents have demanded immediate action to clear waste. It can even pollute the environment and cause health problems and diseases, residents opine. Woman attacked in Valasaravakkam, one held

The Valasaravakkam police arrested a 25-year-old man on Saturday for allegedly attacking and harassing a woman, with whom he had been in a relationshi. The police said the suspect – R Sriram, an employee of a private company in Tiruvarur – forced the woman to talk to him after she had ended their relationship.

According to the police sources, Sriram and the woman, the latter hailing from Mayiladuthurai, pursued MBA together. A few months ago, the woman moved to Chennai, where she has been employed at a private company. After she broke up with him, Sriram allegedly followed her often and argued with her. On Saturday, Sriram went to the woman's house near Valasaravakkam and an argument broke out between the two, during which he attacked her with a stone and fled.

Based on the woman's complaint, the police arrested Sriram and remanded him in judicial custody. Further investigation is underway.

Obscene dance event, 5 arrested

Five men were arrested by the MGR Nagar police for allegedly conducting an obscene dance event at a private bar late Friday night. Police said that based on a tip-off, a team went to the bar and found an event going on. Five men who organized the event prevented police from performing their duty and allegedly threatened them. Police arrested M Dhanu (47), P Vijay Amirtharaj (38), P Vinoth Kumar (31), P Kodish (26) and S Balamurugan (22). The team also seized an amplifier, 330 currency notes of toy money, 10 party cards and 6,100.

Chennai-Mysuru Express superfast to be operated as ordinary from Jan 3

The Chennai-Mysuru Intercity Express will be downgraded from a superfast to an ordinary express starting January 3, following a decision by the South Western Railway (SWR) and approval from the Railway Board. The change comes after a steady increase in stoppages over the years, which has impacted the train's average speed.

Four more trains operated by the Southern Railway will undergo a similar downgrade in January, leading to reduced fares. For the Chennai-Mysuru Intercity Express, ticket fares will drop by Rs 15 for second sitting and Rs 45 for chair car classes. Additionally, passengers in districts like Tirupattur, Vellore and Ranipet, where the train is highly patronised, will benefit from express season tickets priced Rs 150 lower than the superfast season tickets.

As per an official note, the Chennai-Mysuru Superfast Express will be renumbered from 12609/12610 to 16551/16552 starting January 3. The train currently departs Chennai Central at 1.35 pm, reaches Bengaluru at 7.55 pm, and arrives in Mysuru at 10.50 pm, with stoppages at 23 stations. Covering a distance of 497 km in nine hours and 15 minutes, the train maintains an average speed of 54 km/h. Initially operated between Chennai and Bengaluru, it was extended to Mysuru in January 2019, press release said.

Absence of bus shelter

Forced to wait under the scorching sun without any shade, commuters are left fuming at P T Rajan Salai bus stop in K K Nagar. They blame it on the shifting of regular bus shelters owing to the second phase work of the Chennai Metro Rail Limited (CMRL). Commuters have to brave the scorching heat as there is no roof or shelter. There are hardly any other projections, either by way of a roof or a sunshade for them to take shelter under when it rains.

Chennai Corporation is planning to redesign bus shelters to improve facilities for commuters, focussing on better aesthetics, and protection from the extreme weather phenomenon. Engineers have started redesigning the bus shelters, ensuring safety and security of women, making it a safe place during a disaster event. Scores of regular commuters along the road wait every day under the scorching sun due to lack of bus shelter.



Senior citizen scheme

The Senior Citizen Savings Scheme (SCSS), launched in 2004, has become a popular and secure investment option for senior citizens in India.
