Voice of GOD



This is the 155th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and the 38th sthalam on the north side of river Kaveri in Chozha Nadu. During ancient times this place was called Santhanaranyam with sandalwood trees.

In Periyapuranam Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva of Thirunallam. In this, he registers that Therazhundur temple was a mada koil/temple. But now the temple is on the ground level, may be brought down during renovation, by the Chozhas. Moolavar: Sri Vedapureeswarar, Sri Athyabakesar. Consort: Sri Soundaranayagi

Some of the Salient features of this temple are...

The temple faces west with a 5-tier Rajagopuram.
Balipeedam, Dwajasthambam, and Rishabam are immediately after the Rajagopuram. In koshtam
Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy (Medha Dakshinamurthy).
Lingothbavar, Brahma, and Chathurbhuja Durgai.
In prakaram Sri Madeswarar on the left and Ambal Sannathi on the right. Ashta Dikku Thisaipalakaa's paintings and Stucco dwarapalakas.

In the inner prakaram Subramaniar, Navagrahas, Kshethra Lingam, Kadambavaneswarar, Valanchuzhi Vinayagar, Kaveri Ashta dikpalakas in painting, Stucco dwarapalakas, Agasthiyar and Chandikeswarar. In Navagrahas except Suriyan others are facing Suryan and Suryan is facing west.

ARCHITECTURE

A Vesara Vimana is over the sanctum. The sanctum sanctorum consists of sanctum antarala and artha mandapam. The artha mandapam is of Vavval nethi type. A Moat is around the sanctum, which may be due to the rise of ground level.

HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original Mada temple existed before the 7th Century and may have been built by Ko Chengat Chozha. Later the same was reconstructed as a stone temple during The Chozha period and further extended during the Vijayanagara period.

As per the inscriptions, this place was called Jayankonda Chozhavalanattu Thiruvazhunthur nattu Thiruvazhunthur, and Lord Shiva was called Thiruvazhunthur Udayar and Thiruvazhunthur Udayar Thirumadamudaya Nayanar.

Kulothunga Chozha-III's inscription records his meikeerthi as Thiribhuvana Chakravarthi Maduraiyum, Eezhamum, Karuvoorum, Pandyan Mudithalaiyum koNdu Veerabhishekam and Viajayabhishekam panniyarulina Thiribhuvana Veerathevan and Maduraiyum Karuvoorum Eezhamum Pandyam mudithalaiyum kondaruliya Sri Chozha Kerala thevan. One of the inscriptions records the endowment of thirumanjanam of Lord Shiva for which water was brought from river Kaveri. Donations were made for the same

On 23rd June 1999, maha Kumbhabhishekam was conducted after renovations.

LEGENDS: Vedas, Devas, and Ashtadikpalakas worshiped Lord Shiva of this temple.

When Agasthiyar was worshiping Lord Shiva of this temple, without knowing a Deva was traveling in the sky in a Chariot, which disturbed Agasthiyar's worship. So Agasthiyar made the Deva's Chariot to ground. Hence this place is called Therazhundur. He found that the sage Agasthiyar was worshiping Lord Shiva. He realized the reason why his Chariot got struck up and landed here. He prayed to Agasthiyar and pardoned him. Hence this place was called Therazhundur.

Introduction of digital ticketing

MRL would like to inform passengers that, the facility of purchasing Group Ticket issued as Paper ticket, at ticketing counters for a group of 20 & above with 10% discounted fare, will be withdrawn w.e.f 1.3.2025. This measure is taken to facilitate migration to digital ticketing.

However, the same product can be purchased through CMRL mobile App as a QR-Group ticket with 20% discounted fare. CMRL is committed to continuously improve the quality of its services.

SR targets may completion for Kilambakkam Station

Southern Railway aims to complete the construction of the Kilambakkam halt station by May 2025. Chennai Divisional Railway Manager B. Vishwanath Eerya confirmed that 50% of the work is done, with platform earthwork and gravel filling completed. Platform shelter and overhead electric line installations are progressing rapidly. Originally set for completion in February, the project was delayed due to a State government request for an additional rainwater drainage culvert. The halt station, located between Vandalur and Urappakkam, is crucial as south-bound bus operations are shifting to Kilambakkam. The State allocated 20 crore for the station, while a 79 crore skywalk connecting it to the Kilambakkam bus terminus remains in early stages. To support commuter movement, MTC plans to introduce over 100 additional buses to Kilambakkam, adding to the existing 600 buses making 3,800 daily trips across 80 routes.

Roof makeover at 200 bus shelters in Chennai



The shocking disclosure that came from the survey conducted by CUMTA was about the presence of 200 bus stands without any roofs in Chennai.

Under the GCC or Greater Chennai Corporation, there are 2000 bus stops and 200 bus shelters on major bus routes are without roofs. Mayor R. Priya made it clear yesterday that these 200 bus shelters would get roofing make-over at a cost of Rs 34 crores.

Information is that bus shelters present in places like Ekkatuthangal, Guindy and West Saidapet etc would get a makeover with tensile roofs at an cost of Rs 4.47 cr. At an amount of Rs 16 cr, 4 bus terminals present in places like Saligramam would be upgraded. This would decongest the traffic and aid in easy bus movements.

TTD to introduce world's first gold, silver pendant ATMs at Tirumala

Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) is set to introduce the world's first Gold and Silver Pendant ATMs at the sacred Tirumala temple. The machines, which will dispense pendants embossed with Lord Venkateswara and Goddess Lakshmi Devi, aim to mergedevotion with technology. Unlike commercial gold ATMs in the UAE, these feature AI-enabled interfaces similar to banking ATMs, requiring minimal additional steps. The initiative, led by TTD executive officer (EO) J Shyamala Rao, is part of TTD's digital transformation, with installations planned at Tirumala Temple, Govindaraja Temple in Tirupati, and Padmavati Ammavari Temple in Tiruchanoor.

"The software is designed for ease—anyone can operate it with just one or two extra steps compared to a cash ATM," Rao told TNIE. However, he clarified that the project would move forward only if it aligns with sacred scriptures and Agamas, ensuring adherence to temple traditions. TTD is actively engaging with software firms and AI startups to finalise the technology. Several companies are scheduled to present proposals and demonstrate machine prototypes.

The Gold and Silver Pendant ATMs will offer pendants in 2g, 5g, and 10g variants. These will enable purchases without human intervention, marking a significant step in integrating technology with tradition.



New SWD lines for Saidapet

Saidapet, an area highly prone to water-logging in the city, is set to get a new stormwater drain (SWD)\ network, worth 12 crore, to prevent the perennial annual inundation. Health minister Ma. Subramanian on Thursday launched the work in 1.54km worth 5.10 crore, covering various streets.

Inaugurating the work, the minister said that areas like Subramanya Salai, Thiruvallur Street, Jothiamman Nagar, and Jothiramanlingam Nagar experienced annual inundation in the past. But now these areas are prevented from flooding.

Govindan Road, Vadivelpuram, Kodambakkam Road, and K.P Koil Street areas were affected due to the water flowing from Ashok Nagar Avenue Road. Usually this water flows through Pushpavathi Street canal which was blocked for the last

The new SWD work will be executed in K R Koil Street (520 m) Samvana Street (220 m) Ellaiamman Koil Street (455 m) and Govindan Salai (345 m). Apart from this, a contract has been awarded for SWD work in Thalaivar Street, Kumaran Street (441 m) Govindan Salai Street (445 m) and Reddykuppam Road (4.5 m).

Now, due to the summer, a greater number of people consume lemon, which has increased the demand and led to an increase in the rate as well', said Koyambedu Semi Wholesalers Association president.

'Lemon is brought from Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Mysuru', he added.

Police arrested youth for burgling house

A youth from Tambaram was arrested by Choolaimedu police for burgling cash and gold in a house in Choolaimedu. Police recovered the stolen gold jewellery that he had hidden by the side of railway tracks near Tambaram. According to the police, on March 15, V. Venkatasubramanian of Gill Nagar in Choolaimedu and his family locked their house and went out at 10.30 a.m. When they returned at 3.30 p.m., they found that the house had been broken into. In the complaint, Venkatasubramanian said 38 sovereigns of gold jewellery and 20,000 in cash were stolen.

Police found out from camera footage and arrested the accused, who was identified as V. Vicky alias Vignesh, 22, of Tambaram. During interrogation, he confessed to the crime. Vignesh told the police that he had spent all the cash and hid the jewellery at a spot by the railway tracks near Tambaram. Following his confession, the police recovered 36 sovereigns of gold jewellery.



Woman dies after being hit by EMU train at Saidapet

A woman lost her life after being hit by a EMU train at Saidapet railway station in the early hours of Thursday. Disturbing footage of the incident, showing the woman being thrown by the force of the impact, has raised concerns and shocked viewers,

Authorities are now working to determine whether this was a case of suicide or if the woman accidentally crossed the tracks and was stuck by the train.

The police have launched a detailed investigation into the circumstances surrounding the woman's death.

Man poses as delivery agent, attacks elderly woman

A 41-year-old man who allegedly barged into a house in Valasaravakkam and tried to rob a woman after attacking her with a knife on Friday, has been arrested. According to police, N Mani (65) was a retired nursing professor. She was living with her daughter and son-in-law in Valasaravakkam. On Friday, when she was at home, the accused, M Nagamuthu, allegedly entered the house claiming to have come to deliver medicines.

However, he pulled out a knife, slashed the woman and

threatened her to part with all her jewels and money. When the woman's domestic suddenly help raised alarm, the accused panicked and fled the spot. Police arrested Nagamuthu later in the day, and he was sent to judicial custody on Saturday.



Fire accident in Ramapuram

A massive fire broke out in Ramapuram Sunday evening. Following this, the public left their homes. The electricity supply was also cut off. The fire was extinguished after several hours of struggle.

A fire broke out Sunday evening at a second-hand goods shop in Kothari Nagar, Ramapuram. The fire then spread to nearby shops, including a car mechanic shop and a furniture godown. Upon receiving the information, firefighters from various areas including Virugambakkam and Ramapuram rushed to the spot and

started extinguishing the fire by spraying water.

However, the uncontrollable fire, which spread with smoke and smoke, caused a huge commotion. Nearby residents fled their homes and took shelter on the road. The power supply in the area was immediately disconnected. The Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) is set to launch a drive soon compelling all shops to be named in Tamil. The State government is likely to intensify action against violators. The Corporation would initiate action as per the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Urban Local Bodies Rules, 2023, for revocation or suspension of trade licence. Around 70,000 shops receive trade licences from GCC every year.

The Corporation issues trade licences for shops after the traders give a declaration that they would use name boards in Tamil, English and a third language with a font size ratio of 5:3:2.

2,000 monthly pass for all bus services

The MTC is set to launch a new 2,000 monthly pass, allowing unlimited travel on all Chennai city buses, including AC services. According to a scheme is expected to roll out by May or June, with MTC finalizing the implementation process.

Currently, a \$\Pi\$1,000 monthly pass is available for commuters. Passengers have urged MTC to retain the existing pass alongside the new scheme to ensure affordability for all.



Residents point out that bins starts overflowing in a day whereas it is cleaned every two or three days. We are forced to dump on the roads due to increase in population, says Ravi a local resident. The civic body for effective implementation must take steps to accommodate an additional bin to bring a permanent solution laments residents.
